


HOST CHECKLIST

Would you like to host a SPARK THE FLAME!



How to do:

BEFORE

- Date and time
- Location with fireplace(-bowl)
- Host persons (1-3 persons)
- Cooperation (optional)
- Detailed text and location description
- Preparation Input

DURING

- Lighter or survival kit
- Dry firewood
- Paper and ignition wool
- Material for input
- IMPORTANT: All participants bring their own food/drink and blankets.
- Camera

AFTERWARD

- Documentation Website (Photos)
- Hosts and all participants: List SPARK THE FLAME! as an artistic activity in the CV: e.g. 2025 SPARK THE FLAME! @art+care, participatory performance, Basel Dreispitz



The **places**, **dates** and **times** are decided by the hosts themselves. What works well for you?

Send us your **detailed text** and the **location description**. The event will be shared on the [art+care website](#) and [channels](#). The deadline for the newsletter is the 20th of each month.

The SPARK THE FLAME! format aims to promote participation, visibility and exchange in a simple way at different locations.
